Read Philippians 1:18b-26 Make 2-3 observations of what you see in the text and note any questions you have. Try to answer your questions by using information you find in the passage. Then answer some or all of the questions below.

Paul says he will rejoice because he is certain that despite his situation he will be set free (saved/delivered). What do you think gives Paul this confidence?

Paul quotes directly from Job 13:16 in vs 19.

Read Job 13:1-19. What parallels/connections do you see? What can we learn from the way Paul uses scripture?

Paul believes that his freedom from prison will come through the prayers of the Philippians and the help of the Spirit of Jesus Christ.

What does this teach us about the importance of prayer?

What is the relationship between prayer and the Spirit?

Why does Paul refer to the Spirit as the Spirit of Jesus Christ?

When you are in a hard situation do you tend to go it alone or do you lean on the prayers of others?

Why is it important to have other people praying for you and not simply relying on your own prayers?
