

# Good Friday: A Service of Shadows

On Good Friday we pause to observe the most grief-stricken of holy days as we remember Christ's suffering and death on the cross. Before we can race ahead to the good news of Easter Sunday we must first confront the horrors of Good Friday and take a clear-eyed look at what Jesus endured for our sake. He was wounded for our transgressions and crushed for our iniquities; his suffering exceeds what we can imagine and to simply gloss over it would be an insult to his great love which motivated this truly outrageous action of self-sacrifice.

Tonight we are marking Good Friday by holding a service of shadows. It is a tradition which stretches back to the 700s when Christians would hold night-long prayer vigils to commemorate Christ's death. Through the course of the vigil they would slowly extinguish candles, each one symbolizing apostles and followers of Jesus who fled and abandoned him on the night of his arrest, trial, and execution. The room would slowly grow darker until the only remaining light came from the large Christ-candle. The service would culminate with a loud noise representing Jesus' death, and then the candle would be extinguished to mark Jesus' entrance into the grave. The total darkness of the room suggested the hopeless and despair of the disciples, indeed the whole world, when death had appeared to have triumphed over God.

However, as the service went through the night, the light from the dawn would slowly begin to light up the room again and served as a foreshadowing of the resurrection and the hope of Jesus permanently dispelling the darkness.

#### A GOOD FRIDAY PRAYER

#### Gracious Father,

We remember today, the pain and suffering of the cross, and all that Jesus was willing to endure, so we could be set free. He paid the price, such a great sacrifice, to offer us the gift of eternal life.

Help us never to take for granted this huge gift of love on our behalf. Help us to be reminded of the cost of it all. Forgive us for being too busy, or distracted by other things, for not fully recognizing what you have freely given, what you have done for us.

Thank you Lord that by your wounds we are healed. Thank you that because of your huge sacrifice we can live free. Thank you that sin and death have been conquered and that your Power is everlasting.

Thank you that we can say with great hope, "It is finished..." For we know what's still to come. And death has lost its sting. We praise you for you are making all things new.
