Talk About It - Intercession

Pastor Adam talked about intercessory prayer as prayer where we stand in the gap for others and pray for them by joining our prayers with God's will and desire for them.

Read Romans 8:26-27 & 34, and Hebrews 7:25

Consider each passage one by one. What does each one teach us about intercession and intercessory prayer?

Practice It - Practical Ideas for Being an Intercessor

Join the Sunday morning prayer group at First Cov.

Create an intercession journal with pictures of people/places you are praying for. Note your requests, invitations you receive from God, and answers to prayers.

Notice when people come to mind throughout the day. Ask the Spirit if this is an invitation to pray and how best to pray.

Before you pray for someone, ask God what desires, concerns, ideas, or outcomes you need to surrender to him.

Create a weekly prayer list with different topics for each day. Spend time listening in prayer before speaking. When you don't know how best to pray, simply offer the people/issues up to the Holy Spirit and ask him to intercede.

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
